Dear Parents/Guardians,

On behalf of the Prep team, I would like to welcome you all back for another term of learning. We hope that you have all had a well-deserved rest over the break and are ready to dive into the term ahead. We have some exciting things planned for the students this term and look forward to seeing their reactions to all the exciting learning opportunities ahead.

The concepts being covered this term have been outlined for you in the table below:

Maths	Reading	Writing
Place Value: Students will learn about how numbers are made using our place value system 'TEN OF THESE IS ONE OF THOSE'. We will explore ways to make, name and record numbers and how we use this understanding to manipulate numbers later in the year. We will also focus on skip counting by tens here so feel free to practise this skill at home to support your child's numeracy fluency.	Author Study- Eric Carle: Students will explore the author Eric Carle and his famous collection of books. We will study the text structures and features he uses including rhyme and repetition. The students will use Eric Carle as inspiration for their own texts and will explore the way authors use the writing process to publish their texts. At home you may like to visit Eric Carle's Website where you can see his texts and complete some fun activities. https://eric-carle.com/	Procedure Students will explore the genre of procedure. They will learn about their text structures and features and how we use these to make or do something. Through the term the students will begin to write their own procedures. making a 'How to Book' to share with their families. At home you can support your child by following procedures together. For example: making a cake, tying their shoelaces or putting a model together.
Money Students will learn about Australian currency. They will recognise the notes and coins and their features, including their value, size, and appearance. At home, you may like to talk about money and help them read money amounts when at the grocery store. You might also like to provide students with a small coin to spend at the school canteen to support them to use money in a real life context. Location The students will explore the concept of	Guided Reading Students will be a part of a weekly guided reading group, where they will work collaboratively with their peers and teacher to explore both decoding and comprehension concepts. This will allow them to be effectively scaffolded to achieve their personal reading goals.	Daily Writing Daily writing is a way for students to learn new vocabulary and complex sentence structures. We will be working on the sentence structure: 'When, who what they did.' This is a great way for students to build their confidence to be independent writers as it is scaffolded by their teachers.
The students will explore the concept of location through drawing simple maps and using prepositional language to describe the location of familiar objects.		



Global Studies

This unit aims to provide the students with a holistic view of the world in which they live. They will learn about the land which they occupy making them at one with their country.

They will learn about ways to share history and how people communicate through stories. They will learn how to represent the location of places and their features on simple maps of their local community and country.
