Geology Activities

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Your child will be involved in the Staughton Vale Middle School Program at the Staughton Vale Campus in 2023. It is a unique outdoor learning environment that provides the opportunity for students to engage in hands on activities that are challenging, expand their knowledge of food sustainability/security, and connect them with the natural environment. Students will be immersed in rich learning experiences that support and enhance the curriculum taught in Year 8.

Staughton Vale Campus

The Staughton Vale Campus is situated at 155 Staughton Vale Road, Staughton Vale, on the fringe of the Brisbane Ranges National Park near Anakie and consists of over 200 acres of fertile pastures, orchards, dams and natural forest.

Program

Year 8 students will travel to the campus 3 times over the course of the year. The first experience will focus on Geology. Students will participate in 3 activities with their science teacher, helping them understand how rocks are formed, land is shaped and changes over time, and concepts of plate tectonics. Students will,

- Explore how water flow over land changes the landscape through weathering and erosion of rocks and depositing sediments – simulate different stream flows,
- In the kitchen, explore plate tectonics using crackers and icing to understanding different kinds of plate movement and what effect they each have on the Earth's crust, and
- Learn about the geology of the region at Anakie Gorge in the adjacent Brisbane Ranges
 National Park see the distinct layers of rock and how wind, water and tectonic activity
 shaped the landscape over time.
