Dear Parents/Guardians,

MADDINGLEY CAMPUS

I am writing to update you on where we are currently at with the COVID situation at the School. As throughout this crisis we are looking in our response to balance reasonable requirements to protect the health of students, staff and the community with the equally valid desire for students to be back at school. I am also at this time of the year have a further prime consideration of the protection of the Year 12 students and their examination period.

The School has three confirmed cases of COVID-19 at present. Those students (Year 8 and Year 12) were at school when it could reasonably be inferred that they may be infectious. We have asked that all students in Years 8 and 12 seek testing as a matter of some urgency.

The School has commenced the process of cleaning the Senior School where the students were on Wednesday to Friday. This process is likely to continue until Thursday 21 October. The Premier has also announced an early return to school for everyone in Regional Victorian schools commencing this Friday 22 October.

As a result of all of these considerations, we have decided to modify this week's return to school schedule to the following (*Please note these arrangements may change subject to DHHS advice*) and are different to what happened last term:

1. Prep to Year 2

May attend the campus for onsite learning on all days this week.

2. Year 3 & 4

Will attend onsite on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. They will be online on Thursday and will return to onsite learning on Friday 22 October.

3. <u>Year 5 & 6</u>

Will be online until Wednesday 20 October and then return to onsite learning from Thursday 21 October.

4. <u>Year 7</u>

Will be engaged on online learning until Tuesday 19 October and then onsite learning from Wednesday 20 October.

5. <u>Year 8</u>

Any Year 8 students declared a personal close contact by DHHS must follow any advice they are provided by DHHS. Year 8 students who are not declared primary close contacts may return to school onsite from Wednesday 20 October. Students will be asked to obtain a negative COVID-19 test result before returning to school.



6. Year 9 & 10

Will work online until Tuesday 19 October and return onsite on Wednesday 20 October, will be online Thursday 21 October and onsite Friday 22 October.

7. <u>Year 11</u>

Will work online until Tuesday 19 October and will return onsite from Wednesday 20 October. <u>This may alter for students engaged in a Unit 3/4 Examinations</u>. Further information to follow.

8. Year 12

One of our prime concerns at present is the protection of the Year 12 Examinations. As such classes will remain online for the remainder of the week and end of year activities will be postponed until after the examination period. There will be changed arrangements for SWOT-VAC. Further information to follow.
